Boat owners calling the Fish and Boat Commission's Boat Registration Office (717-657-4551) will be greeted by a new automated boat registration and titling help line starting July 23. According to Peter A. Colangelo, the Commission's Executive Director, the new phone system will answer many of the most commonly-asked questions by callers to our boat registration staff. "We know many of our callers have been frustrated by busy signals and long waits, and we hope this automated system will be a positive improvement," Colangelo said.

The new system is menu-driven and provides information on many questions asked by persons seeking registrations and titles for their boats. 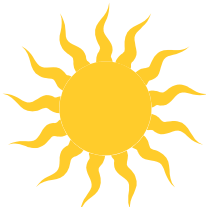
SAILING REGATTA FOR MS
