CHANNEL HAILING

In the ninth Coast Guard District (Great Lakes region), a new primary hailing channel takes effect on July 1, 2000. On that date channel 9 will replace channel 16 for hailing by recreational boaters in US waters. The action is being taken to reduce the radio traffic on channel 16, which has risen to record levels. Distress calls should still be made using channel 16. For more information, please contact your local Coast Guard Station.

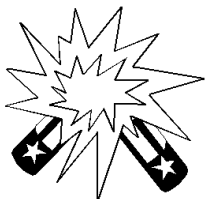
